THE UNITED NATIONS AND ROTARY INTERNATIONAL

The United Nations and Rotary have a long history of working together and sharing similar visions for a more peaceful world.

In 1942, Rotary clubs from 21 nations organized a conference in London to develop a vision for advancing education, science, and culture after World War II. That event was a precursor to UNESCO. In 1945, 49 Rotarians went to San Francisco as delegates, advisors and consultants to help draft the UN Charter. Rotary has been a close partner of the UN ever since and currently holds the highest consultative status offered to a nongovernmental organization by the UN's Economic and Social Council, which oversees many specialized UN agencies. This is a partnership that the United Nations and Rotary holds with pride.

ROTARY'S POLIO PLUS The Global Polio Eradication Initiative

After **20** years of hard work, Rotary and its partners are on the brink of eradicating this tenacious disease, but a strong push is needed now to root it out once and for all. It is a window of opportunity of historic proportions.

Rotary is raising \$200 million globally to match \$355 million in challenge grants received from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. As of 30 June 2011, Rotarians have raised about US\$185.1 million for Rotary's US\$200 Million Challenge. The total sum of \$555 million will directly support immunization campaigns in developing countries, where polio continues to infect and paralyze children, robbing them of their futures and compounding the hardships faced by their families.

As long as polio threatens even one child *anywhere* in the world, children everywhere remain at risk due to its highly contagious nature. The stakes are that high.

Rotary's contribution to the eradication effort has already spared an estimated 5 million children from a lifetime of paralysis. Please donate generously and help us to eradicate the remaining 1% of the debilitating disease.

ROTARY'S GLOBAL SPEARHEADING PARTNERS

UNICEF

UNICEF procures and distributes polio vaccines for routine and supplementary immunizations. UNICEF participates, along with WHO, in the implementation of intensified National Immunization Days and Sub national Immunization Days, as well as mop-up campaigns at the country level.

U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

The Atlanta-based CDC deploys epidemiologists, public health experts, and scientists to WHO and UNICEF. CDC also works as the "viral detective" of the four partners, using its state-of-the-art virological surveillance expertise (genetic fingerprinting) to investigate outbreaks of polio, identify the strain of poliovirus involved and pinpoint its exact geographical origin.

World Health Organization

WHO, through its headquarters, regional and country offices, provides the overall technical direction and strategic planning for the management and coordination of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.
